Federer relishes chance to play in 'beautiful' Istanbul

IT'S not often that Roger Federer gets to play in a new country, and 24 hours into his visit to Istanbul, the Swiss has already relished the "winning edge" manifesto.

Figó in bid to get Asian votes

LONDON — Fifa presidential candidate Luis Figó will hope to convince delegates at this week's Asian Football Confederation Congress that a vote for him would boost the region's chances of more places in future World Cup finals.

Figó told Reuters before he left for tomorrow's congress in the Bahrain capital of Manama that he also wanted more non-Europeans involved in working for Fifa, which should become more of a multi-cultural organisation.

32 finalists but nothing is yet written in stone for tournaments beyond that date with Asia currently allocated four guaranteed berths at finals and the possibility of a fifth via an inter-continental playoff.

Figó added: "I propose the Fifa congress should study and decide on a new format for the best competition in the world."

"I'm convinced this is the future and I don't believe the World Cup quality would be affected."

The former Portugal international (42) said in an e-mail exchange that the increased popularity of the sport in Asia and rising standards of play were just two reasons why he wanted to see the World Cup expanded.

"By increasing the number of teams participating in the World Cup, we not only make sure that we include more countries from across the world, but also enable Fifa to raise significant increased revenues that can be used to invest in the growth of the game globally!"

"I think the growing popularity and quality of football in the different regions represented within AFC are arguments in favour of opening the debate around expanding the World Cup to 40 or 48 teams with additional teams weighted towards non-European nations," he said.

Figó will also tell Asian delegates of his plan for what he calls "football hubs" involving localised regular meetings with presidents and general secretaries of national associations.

Figó's proposal for a larger World Cup is one of the cornerstones of his manifesto and he intends to tell Asian delegates exactly how they can benefit from his plan.

"I think these would benefit the AFC. Representing countries from the Middle East to Australia, the AFC is the confederation with more time zones than any other."

The presidential election takes place during the Fifa Congress in Zurich on May 29. — Reuters.

MERTENS CRITICAL AFTER COLLAPSE

BELGIUM under-21 international Gregory Mertens is critically ill in hospital after collapsing on the pitch during a reserve team match for Sporting Lokeren, his club said.

"Sporting Lokeren sympathises with the family and hopes for a positive outcome." Club doctor Kris Peeters was quoted by website Nieuwsblad.be as saying the 24-year-old Mertens was in a critical condition.

The match against Genk was 15 minutes old when Mertens collapsed.

"Everything points to a cardiac arrest," Peeters said.

Belgian media said he had suffered cardiac arrest and received CPR on the pitch, leading to the match being abandoned.

"Our defender was immediately assisted by the medical team of Sporting Lokeren and KRC Genk," a statement read.
