Herewith, please find a map I have extracted from the Spatial Development Specialist Study. The proposed double circuit 400 kV transmission lines from the sub-station, which form part of this application, are proposed to follow a route down the eastern side of the existing 275 kV transmission line which is already within the previously authorised VSHA corridor.

Thus, according to my map data I don't believe the transmission lines will cross Transnets NMPP pipeline but the preferred alignment is likely to cross Transnets TPL pipeline.
I have also attached Google Earth files which may make it easier to view.

The Impact Assessment phase of the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) for the above project is nearing completion. A Draft Environmental Impact Assessment Report (DEIAR) has been prepared in terms of the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations 2010, published in Government Notice R543 of 18 June 2010, under Section 24 of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998). The Draft Environmental Impact Assessment Report (DEIAR) is available for review and comment by members of the public for a 40 calendar day period from **31 October 2016 to 15 December 2016**.

Water Use License Application

Eskom is required to obtain a Water Use License for the proposed Isundu Sub-station (in terms of section 40(4) of the National Water Act (Act No. 36 of 1998)). A Water Use License Application (WULA) was been prepared for water uses

that will occur on the proposed Isundu Sub-Station site. The public is invited to review the WULA and provide comments. The public review period is 60 working days (from **31 October 2016 to 15 February 2017**).

2. **The public comment period for the DEIAR is 40 calendar days, commencing on 31 October 2016 and ending on 15 December 2016.**
3. **The public comment period for the WULA is 60 working days, commencing on 31 October 2016 and ending on 15 February 2017.**
4. Organs of state such as municipalities and government departments have received full versions of the DEIAR.
5. Comments received on the DEIAR will be used to produce the Final Environmental Impact Assessment Report, which will be available for public comment for a period of 21 calendar days prior to submission to the Department of Environmental Affairs (DEA) for consideration. A letter will be sent to all Registered Interested and Affected Parties informing them of the availability of the Final Environmental Impact Assessment Report as well as DEA’s decision on the Application for Environmental Authorisation.
