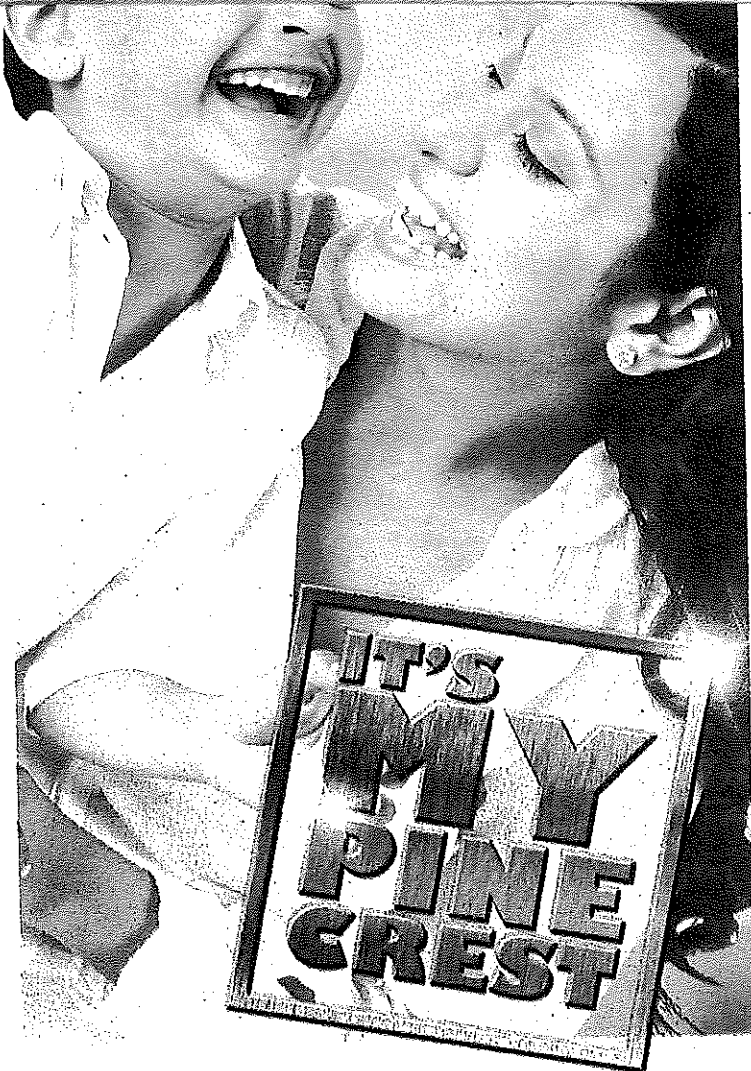

NOTICE OF ENVIRONMENTAL AUTHORISATION AND WATER USE LICENSING PROCESS



Proposed Capacity Improvements to National Route 2 (N2) and National Route 3 (N3) within the Ethekweni Metropolitan Municipality, KwaZulu-Natal

Project Proponent: South African National Roads Agency SOC Limited (SANRAL)
SANRAL proposes to provide additional traffic carrying capacity on the following sections of national road within the Ethekweni Metropolitan Municipality, including the interchanges (I/C) along these sections:

- N2 from Solomon Mahlangu Interchange to south of Umgeni Road Interchange.
- N3 from EB Cloete Interchange to Key Ridge Interchange.

The project forms part of the suite of Strategic Infrastructure Projects (SIPs) as described in the National Development Plan, 2011. These roads are operating at full capacity. Upgrades will provide from 4 to 7 lanes in each direction to accommodate future traffic growth and improve safety. Widening will primarily be accommodated within the existing median and road reserve; however, additional land will be acquired in limited areas. Modification of existing bridges and interchanges, including Solomon Mahlangu, EB Cloete, Spine Road, Paradise Valley, Farningham (M7) and Richmond Road, will be required. Counter flow lanes will be divided by a concrete barrier and retaining perimeter walls will be constructed where required. Demolition of redundant structures will occur. Temporary roads will be constructed to gain access beneath the Westville, Paradise and uMhlalazana Viaducts.

Environmental Authorisation Process

The project is subject to the provisions of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (NEMA) (Act No. 107 of 1998) (as amended). As the project triggers various activities listed in the 2014 Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations (GN R983, GN R985), environmental authorisation is required from the national Department of Environmental Affairs. SANRAL has appointed ACER (Africa) Environmental Consultants to undertake the application for environmental authorisation, which requires the preparation of Basic Assessment Reports, inclusive of technical investigations and public participation.

Water Use Licence Application

The project will involve several stream/river crossings and construction will occur, in places, close to watercourses and/or within 500m of wetlands. An application(s) for the requisite Water Use Licence(s) will be prepared by ACER on behalf of SANRAL, and submitted to the Department of Water and Sanitation, in accordance with the National Water Act (Act No. 36 of 1998), as amended.
