**Downs have a positive mindset**

IN simple terms, a clean sheet for Mamelodi Sundowns tonight will be enough to take them to their first MTN8 final in three seasons, keeping alive their hopes of winning the competition for the first time since 2007.

But Wayne Arendse, who will be a vital cog in Sundowns' defence when they clash with neighbours SuperSport United in the return leg of the MTN8 semi-final at Lucas Moripe Stadium, has urged his teammates to guard against complacency. With the two teams having played to a 1-1 draw in the first leg, Sundowns will head into tonight's encounter with the advantage, thanks to an away goal. But Arendse knows that if it will be naive of them to rely on their away goal in order to book place in the final.

This is, after all, a team that has failed to win the MTN8 for 12 years despite dominating South African football and winning almost every other trophy on offer for the past six years.

"The away goal is not really an advantage because teams go into the games to score," Arendse said.

"They can score only one goal (and keep a clean sheet), and they are basically done. It's not really an advantage, unless the game ends in a 0-0 draw. But we know what to do, and we have a positive mindset of scoring goals and keeping a clean sheet."

Add to the fact that while Sundowns last made the MTN8 final in 2016, where they were trounced 3-0 by Wits, SuperSport are eyeing their third successive appearance in the final.

In 2017, Matsantsantsa walked away with the trophy and a cool cheque of R8million after defeating Cape Town City in the final, but the latter avenged that defeat last season with a 4-1 win on penalties at Moses Mabhida Stadium.

And if anything is to go by from their bright start this sea-

**Boucher happy with Spartans**

TSHWANE Spartans coach Mark Boucher is licking his lips over the potential threat of his international attack that has been assembled for the Mzansi Super League.

Proteas pair Lungi Ngidi and Lutho Sipamla, together with marquee signing Tom Curran of England, as well as South African legend Morne Morkel, complete a tantalising pace attack that is set to test batsmen to the full at Centurion. The 2019 Mzansi Super League season will be played over a five-week period starting on 8 November and running through until 16 December.

The player draft was held earlier this month, with Morkel, who played nearly 200 games for the Proteas across all formats, the first name snapped up on the day.

"We knew what we wanted especially at SuperSport Park where the bounce and pace is going to be very effective, so before the actual draft we retained Lutho and Lungi," Boucher said. "We've also got Tom Curran and we had first pick, so we got Morne Morkel."

"That gives us an international attack. We're very happy with it, whether they can all play together at the same time, we're not too sure because of injury and all of that, which is why I am nervous over their fitness. But this is certainly an attack that on their night, they can roll through any team."

Ngidi and Sipamla were among four players retained from last year - the others being Theunis de Bruyn and Tony de Zorzi - while local marquee AB de Villiers was always set to stay in the city where he has spent his entire domestic career.

And, apart from their fierce frontline pace quartet, the Spartans have also brought in another rising Protea star in Wiaan Mulder, as well as Corbin Bosch.

In terms of spin, their main man is likely to be Roelof van der Merwe, with unknown Afghan Waqar Salamkheil the alternative.

"I was happy with the draft last year as well, but back then things just didn't go according to plan," Boucher said.

"The big thing about last year as well was that our first pick (Ngidi), we lost him through injury, so that set us back quite a bit.

"We had to change the plans and strategies, so we have learnt from last year the way we selected and that's why you would have probably seen with the squad that we selected this year that it's a team where we have got cover for everything.

"I think what we missed last season was maybe finishers and middle-order batsmen. This time we made sure we got a couple of guys that can do that job. It's a more balanced squad and we're happy."

Boucher also elaborated on his choice of 17-year-old spinner Salamkheil, a slow left-arm "chinaman" bowler who has played one Test for Afghanistan and whose name prompted a Google search for most of those following the player draft.

"It was a bit of a brave selection after going through a few videos of his," Boucher said. "I think in this sort of competition you need a bit of a surprise package."

**Stones ruled out of clash with Shakhtar**

MANCHESTER City's defensive injury problems deepened ahead of their opening Champions League clash away to Shakhtar Donetsk with centre-back John Stones being ruled out with a muscle injury.

City manager Pep Guardiola broke the news during his pre-match news conference.

"He made a pass and was injured," Guardiola said, confirming the injury occurred during yesterday's training session. "No problems, he (Fernandinho) can deal with it and he will do well because my players are well. "We will create something, it is what it is."

Fresh from a shock 3-2 Premier League defeat by promoted Norwich City and with French centre-back Aymeric Laporte out injured until January or February, the news that Stones could now miss five weeks gives Guardiola a headache.

"Football is not how you handle good situations, but how you handle bad ones," he said.

**Depleted Team SA to travel to Doha**

ATHLETICS South Africa yesterday announced a depleted team for the IAAF World Championships that will take place in Doha, Qatar from 27 September-6 October.

The national federation provided for the biggest surprise, ditching its own stricter qualifying standards in favour of that of the IAAF. The result is a team of 27 athletes consisting of only five women. Injury withdrawals and controversy have ravished the team with defending champions Wayde van Niekerk and Caster Semenya missing out on the championships. Semenya will not take part in the biennial event due to the IAAF's controversial female eligibility rules, while Van Niekerk has not fully recovered from a knee injury that has sidelined him since the previous championships in 2017.

The sport was rocked by a doping scandal on the eve of the announcement when SA women's 100m record holder Carina Horn received a provisional ban after an adverse analytical finding had been detected in a sample she provided the IAAF.

One-lap hurdles sensation Sokwakhana Zazini withdrew from the team earlier in the day as a precaution due to a bone bruise in his right foot.

SA will be spearheaded by defending world long-jump champion Luvo Manyonga and his podium partner Ruswahl Samaai, who won bronze at the previous showpiece in London.

Akani Simbine will go into the championships as one of SA's medal hopes as he finally looks to bag silverware at the global event. Simbine reached the 100m final at both the Rio Olympics and the London world championships where he finished in fifth place on both occasions.
